







ONE-MAN SHOW PLUS RORY GALLAGHER HOMAGE

Toting three hot new albums and smashing stages worldwide, Aussie axeman Gwyn Ashton has reinvented himself as a one-man progressive alt. blues band and is now on his current Solo Elektro/Sonic Blues Preachers/Ragas, Jugs & Mojo Hands tour in support of his latest three albums.

In two hours Ashton takes us on an eclectic mesmerising musical journey from acoustic roots, blues and world music to a set of electric hard-edged rockin' blues, 60s-style fuzz garage rock and Brit-voiced psychedelia on an array of instruments, including a 1930s National steel guitar, Weissenborn lap slide and his custom-made Italian Liutart signature model guitar. As former frontman in Band Of Friends, he also includes a 'Pickin' On Rory' segment in his shows as a tribute to the late Irish rocker Rory Gallagher.

With no backing tracks or setlist Ashton spontaneously draws his set mostly from eight released studio albums. His lyrical songwriting and musical dexterity on resonator and lap slide guitars mixed with frenetic electric slide, heavy bass lines, hardcore kick drum beats and lo-fi microphone vocals makes him one of the most unique contemporary artists on the scene today.

He's been ranked at number 3 in Guitar Part magazine's Guitarist of The Year after Jeff Beck and Gary Moore and praised by the likes of Robert Plant, Johnny Winter and Deep Purple's Don Airey, who has played on two of Ashton's albums. Hubert Sumlin, Canned Heat, Walter Trout and Mick Fleetwood have all invited him to play with them onstage. He's opened for BB King, Status Quo, Mick Taylor, Buddy Guy, Rory Gallagher, Ray Charles, Junior Wells and many others and appears at festivals and clubs in the UK, Brazil, Malta, Australia and all over Europe.

Ashton has recorded with: Kim Wilson, Robbie Blunt, Chris Glen, Ted McKenna, Don Airey (Deep Purple, Whitesnake, Rainbow) and Gerry McAvoy & Brendan O'Neill (Rory Gallagher). Ashton replaced Thin Lizzy/Motörhead guitarist Brian Robertson fronting Band of Friends - a celebration of the music of Rory Gallagher, featuring his former band members Gerry, Brendan, Lou Martin and Mark Feltham. He has also opened for Peter Green, Johnny Winter, Robin Trower, Jeff Healey, The Yardbirds, Magnum, Ten Years After, Dr Feelgood and many others.

POP / ROCK / BLUES

Solo Elektro is award-winning guitarist Gwyn Ashton's new lo-fi garage one-man stoner distorto blues-rock album. Full of chord-crunching fuzz guitar, dirty octave dividers and slamming kick drum, it's a 100% explosive live-in-a-room recording, sounding retro with a modern evolution as heard on the riff-pumped 'She Won't Tell Me.'

Re-defining the term 'solo artist', Ashton takes a gutsy leap forward in his career by recording all the instruments simultaneously, not layering them and fixing things in the mix. The dirty three-chord rock guitar riff-laden tracks are complemented by radio-friendly songs with strong melodic structure and hooks, co-written with his songwriting partner Garry Allen.

Flanging and phasing like the classic 60s British psychedelic and blues-rock albums, Solo Elektro maintains a contemporary hard edge that should satisfy the most ardent freaky rock & roll fan stumbling around Glastonbury's muddy fields. Prior to this recording session, Ashton came into the possession of a piece of rock music history that made it onto every track — the actual bass drum Bill Ward played on Black Sabbath's first album!

In the middle of a Central European solo tour, sonic explorer Ashton set up his equipment arsenal and mobile studio in a room in the Czech Republic and scattered microphones around the battlefield to track what would become his latest recorded project. With the aim of capturing his live sound onto disc, without any overdubbing, Ashton painstakingly spent each day experimenting and recording each song until the performance, timing and inspiration met together for that 'magic take'.

'This is a tough album. With Gwyn singing, cranking his amps and savagely bashing a kick drum, the crazy spill into the vocal mic had to be tamed.
